READ THE TEXT AND ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS

Serpico

In the early 1970s, Frank Serpico was working as a detective with the New York Police Department. He lived very differently from most policemen. He was a “loner” – he didn’t mix with his colleagues. His home was in Greenwich Village, his hair was long and he had a beard. He wasn’t a typical policeman at all.

Because he was a natural actor and could disguise himself easily, he often worked “*under cover*”. During his work, he discovered something about the N.Y.P.D. that he didn’t like: corruption. He discovered that some of his colleagues accept *bribes* from criminals, and he reported this. No police officer had ever reported corruption in the N.Y.P.D. before.

In court, Serpico gave evidence of corruption against his colleagues. He also said that he was afraid he’d be killed for it. Six months later his *prediction* nearly came true. This is what happened.

The New York police were looking for a man. They were informed that he was at home in the Bronx. Serpico went there to arrest him, with two other policemen. When they tried to arrest him, he shot Serpico in the head at very close range. The other two policemen did nothing. Serpico was very badly hurt, and nearly lost his life.

As soon as *he recovered*, he left the police department. A book was written about his experiences by Peter Maas. (He had met Serpico when he was writing for “New York” magazine). The book immediately became a best seller: three million copies were sold in the United States alone, and it was translated into twelve languages. Soon afterwards a film was made with Al Pacino as Serpico. Maas worked on the film – which was based on his book – but Serpico himself was not involved. Like the book, the film was very successful, and this year a ‘Serpico’ TV series has started. (An actor called David Birney is playing Serpico).

Serpico himself lives in Europe. When he left the police department in 1972, he also left America. The other two policemen (from the raid) are still in New York. They are still in the police department, and they are now both sergeants.
